

Here's the latest update from Cactus Park Precinct:


- On April 10, 2025, officers responded to a robbery attempt at a fast food location near Thunderbird Road and 35th Avenue where the suspect attempted to rob the drive-thru window before fleeing the area in a vehicle. With limited vehicle information Cactus Park Precinct's Real-Time Operations Center specialists located the suspect vehicle and identified a possible suspect. This information was relayed to investigators which resulted in the apprehension of the suspect by specialized tactical enforcement officers. The incredible investigative work by our Real-Time Operations Center personnel and responding officers resulted in the expeditious apprehension of the suspect. Bravo!
- April 19th marked the end of Cactus Park Precinct's four-week crime suppression plan. This
 enforcement plan focused on specific portions of our precinct which culminated in a community
 clean-up at the end of each week. We would like to thank our Neighborhood Enforcement and
 Community Action Teams as well as the Drug Enforcement Bureau, Human Exploitation and
 Trafficking Unit, Transit Unit, Motor Unit, and Adult Probation for their commitment to community
 safety which resulted in the following:

In combination with our enforcement efforts, Cactus Park Precinct would like to thank the Neighborhood Services Department, Grand Canyon University, Calvary Church, and all our community groups and community members who assisted in the neighborhood clean-ups. These clean-ups cleared 6+ tons of trash/debris from our community. Great work everyone!

• On April 20th, 2025, an aggravated assault occurred in the area of 10000 North Metro Parkway East where the suspect pointed a firearm at the victim. Responding officers located the victim and were provided a direction of travel for the suspect. Cactus Park Precinct's Real-Time Operations Center personnel, using field technology, located a possible suspect and guided officers to this location. Upon seeing the officers arriving at his location the suspect fled on foot and was pursued. As the suspect was rapidly approaching the light rail platform, officers used a less lethal compliance tool to thwart his advancement and allow officers to safely apprehend him. Great work by our Cactus Park Precinct officers and Real-Time Operations Center specialists!

- A Phoenix resident, or family member of a Phoenix resident, can go to our website (phoenix.gov/fire or scan the QR code to the right) and complete the request form.
- A member of the Phoenix Fire Department will reach out to schedule the lockbox installation. *At the time of installation, you will need to supply the key for the residence, to put into the lockbox.



3. A member of the Phoenix Fire Department will come to your home and install the lockbox and document the location in the department's computer aided dispatch system (CAD). If there is an emergency and you are unable to open the door, they will use the lockbox key to gain access.

If you already have a lockbox installed and would like to register your lockbox code, or you have a garage door code you would like to register with the department, please visit phoenix.gov/fire to register your lockbox or garage door code.

WHY PARTICIPATE?

This program is free to City of Phoenix residents thanks to the Phoenix area Association of Realtors and Councilwoman O'Brien. It allows first responders to gain access to a home in case of emergencies where the patient is not able to make it to the door.

Safety Signs

The City of Phoenix is working hard to identify ways to improve driver awareness and education and keep our kids safe. Through the City's Vision Zero Yard Sign Pilot Program, the Parks and Recreation Department is distributing *free* "Stay Alive Drive 25" yard signs to residents and businesses for installation on our private property. The goal of this campaign is to reduce traffic fatalities and serious injuries in Phoenix to Zero by 2050.

Your NGS neighborhood association will have a limited number of signs available for pickup at the monthly membership meeting on the second Thursday each month.

You can also pick up a yard sign in person at five designated Parks and Recreation Department community centers: Goelet A.C. Beuf, Maryvale, Longview, Pecos, and Cesar Chavez and at Phoenix City Hall – 5th floor.

Permissible & Prohibited Fireworks Use and Sales

Know the Law: Fireworks Use & Sales

This serves only as a reference guide to aid in understanding items that may or may not be permissible under Arizona state law at the time of publishing. Fireworks sales and use are only allowed during the dates specified by state law and are strictly prohibited at all other times under the Phoenix Fire Code. For updates on sales and use dates, as well as allowed and prohibited items, please refer to the State Law.

Legal Sale Dates

- ★ April 25 May 6
- ★ May 20 July 6
- ★ December 10 January 3
- Two days before the start of Diwali through the third day of Diwali each year.

Legal Use Dates

- ★ May 4 May 6
- ★ June 24 July 6
- 🜟 December 26 January 4
- Second and third days of Diwali each year.

Permissible Use

- Sparklers (Ground and Wire Stick)
- Smoke Devices
- Spinners & Fountains (Includes Ground Spinners & Sparkling Wheels)

Prohibited Use

- ★ Rockets & Aerial Fireworks (Sky Rockets, Bottle rockets, aerial shells)
- Explosive devices
- Anything that rises into the air and explodes is prohibited.

City of Phoenix Water Conservation Incentives

Summer is here! As it warms up, we may be looking at our water bills and wondering how we can lower them? The City has a home water audit program that helps us learn how to conserve water on our own property: https://www.phoenix.gov/administration/departments/waterservices/supply-conservation/save-water/conservation-assistance/residential-water-efficiency-consultations.html

Also, the City of Phoenix has developed three water savings rebates that folks in our community can participate in. This is the first time that the City has offered programs of this kind to help with water conservation efforts.

Summary of the Details:

- Residential Grass Removal \$2.00 per square foot and a minimum 250 square feet must be removed. There are many steps and inspections before and after the project. Credit on your bill, not a check.
- Toilet Rebate Up to \$75.00 reimbursement check. Photo of old toilet with gallons per flush and photo of new installation with receipt. Old toilet must be 3 gallons per flush or greater.
- Irrigation Controller Rebate Up to \$75.00 reimbursement check. Photo of old controller and new controller with receipt. EPA WaterSense model required.
